Explore → Engage → Extend

Watch the gold text. It shows the new language the student adds at each step.

Explore

A simple opinion answer.



"I like my school because it has many good facilities."



2

Engage

Add an opinion, a comparison, and a result.



"**In my opinion**, my school is **better than my old school** because it has more facilities, **so I feel more confident**."



3

Extend

Add a follow-up question to keep the conversation going.



"In my opinion, my school is better than my old school because it has more facilities, so I feel more confident. **What about you?**"

Same student. Same lesson. The answer grows from a sentence into a real conversation.

Writing, built step by step



Academic writing is the backbone of MEP. Each stage adds structure, not just length.

1

STAGE 1

Accurate sentences

Correct word order, capital letters, and punctuation.

2

STAGE 2

Linked sentences

Joining ideas with because, but, so, and also.

3

STAGE 3

A structured paragraph

One opinion, two reasons, and one example.

4

STAGE 4

Planned, longer writing

A clear opening, a middle, and a conclusion.

By year end, your child plans before writing and produces a clear, connected paragraph in English.
